Grant's Good News

One of the best ways to grow deeper spiritually is in relationship with other people of faith. As scripture says, "As iron sharpens iron, so a friend sharpens a friend." (Proverbs 27:17) Here at FCC, we have several small groups that meet on a regular basis. These groups vary in their methods, but all have a similar purpose: to grow closer to one another, and to grow closer to God.

Another great benefit of small groups is that they help people become more intimately connected with the church. People who only attend on Sundays are less likely to stick around for the long term.

Currently, we have two small groups that meet on Sunday mornings: The Fellowship Class, and the Let's Talk About It Class. The Fellowship Class follows a weekly Bible reading plan with an accompanying lesson. The class is taught by Betty Wilson and is a great way to get to know the Bible on a deeper level. The Let's Talk About It Class is currently watching and discussing Rob Bell's series: NOOMA. These videos challenge the way we view our faith and are spiritually enriching.

In addition to our Sunday morning small groups, we have a women's and men's group that meet regularly also. The Ladies of Faith group meets every Thursday for discussion and fellowship. There isn't a set lesson, but usually members bring something for spiritual discussion each week. The Amen Men's group meets once a month on the third Saturday. Donuts are provided, and topics for discussion vary from scripture passages to deeper spirituality.

There are other groups that meet infrequently, so keep your eyes and ears open for those as they don't always follow a set schedule. And starting on November 10, I'll be facilitating a book discussion each Sunday morning at 9:00 am. Our first book will be *What Is the Bible?* by Rob Bell. The class will take a very progressive look at the Bible and faith. Copies of the book can be purchased from your favorite book store, or let me know and I can get you a copy. We simply ask that you take a card with you as a way to buy for one of the residents. It is requested that we put the gifts in gift bags instead of wrapping them. Most of the items requested are things like clothes, socks, gloves, and sugar free food and candy. The expected cost is \$15-\$20 per gift bag. The gifts may be dropped off here at the church, and are needed by December 1.
